



Brethren Killed in the Great War 1914 - 1918

1. Archibald Brown Troop,

Corporal, 4th Battalion Black Watch Killed on the 9th May 1915. Aged 43.

He has no known grave and is remembered on the Le Touret Memorial', Pas de Calais, France.

Possibly killed during the Aubers Ridge attack.

He was initiated on the 6th October 1910, and is described in the petition book as a Coal Merchant living at 'Oakbank' Church Street, Broughty Ferry.



2. George Ramsay Stewart,

Private, Canadian Infantry, Western Ontario Regiment. Killed on the 23rd September 1916. Aged 28.

The Battle of the Somme,

He lies in the Sunken Road Cemetery, Contalmaison, France.

He was Initiated on the 20^{th} July 1911 and is described in the petition book as a Steam Fitter, residing at 21 Fort Street, Broughty Ferry.



3. Alexander Webster,

Private, 16th Battalion Australian Imperial Force, Killed 31st August 1916, aged 28. The Battle of the Somme.

He has no known grave and is commemorated on the Villers-Bretonneux Memorial.

He was initiated on the 25th August 1910 and is described in the petition book as a Bleacher, residing at 8 David Street, Broughty Ferry.



4. James Sinclair,

Lance Corporal, "B" Coy, 14th Battalion, Royal Welsh Fusiliers. Died 24th June 1917, aged 29.

One of the Battles around Yper. He is buried in Bard Cottage Cemetery, Yper.

He was initiated on the 10th September 1914 and is described in the Petition book as a Barman, residing at 3 Lawrence Street, Broughty Ferry

5. John Adamson Lorimer,

Private, 2nd Battalion, Royal Scots, Died 13th Nov. 1916, aged 40.

The Somme. Buried in the Serre Road Cemetery No.1, Pas de Calais, France.

He was initiated on the 8th May 1902 and is described in petition book as a 'Van Man' residing at 25 David Street, Broughty Ferry.



6. Alexander Kirkpatrick Collins,

2nd Lieutenant, 12/13th Battalion Northumberland Fusiliers. Died 29th May 1918, aged 23. Possibly killed during the Battles of the Aisne & Marne.

He has no known grave and is commemorated on the Soissons Memorial, Aisne, France.

He was initiated on the 6th May 1915 and is described in the petition book as a Commercial Traveller residing at Craigview, Gray Street, Broughty Ferry.



7. Alexander Murray Stewart,

Pioneer 20th Signal Coy, Royal Engineers. Died 7th July 1918, aged 35.

This during the 2nd Battle of the Marne.

He is buried at Aubigny Communal Cemetery extension. Pas de Calais, France.

He was initiated on the 4th October 1906 and is described in the petition book as an Organist residing at Osborne Terrace, Broughty Ferry.



8. William Milne Fraser,

William Fraser, S/25285, 1st Battalion Queens Own Cameron Highlanders. Died 18th April 1918, aged 34

He is remembered at the Loos Memorial, Pas de Calais

He was initiated on the 25th December 1915, aged 31 and is described in the petition book as a Public House Manager, 12 Canal Street Perth.

9. Alexander Thomson Norrie,

Private, 8th Battalion Black Watch, Died 6th Sept 1917, aged 27.

Buried at Grevilliers British Cemetery, Bapaume, France

He was initiated on 27th November 1913, age 23, described in the petition book as a Trawl Fisherman, 8 Fort Street, Broughty Ferry



10. Charles Spalding Geekie,

Private, Army Service Corps, Died 6th October 1917. Buried at Iringa Cemetery, Tanzania (formerly German East Africa).

He was initiated 12th September 1912, age 25, described in the petition book as a Butcher, Cyprus Cottage, Broughty Ferry.

Son of Alexander and Janet Geekie, Cyprus Cottage, Monifieth.



11. Donald Bain,

Chief Engineer, age 46, Mercantile Marine, S.S. Redemere (Manchester). Steamer, Armed Merchantship. Died 28th Oct 1917

Torpedoed without warning and sunk by UB-40, 6 miles WSW from St Catherine's, Isle of Wight, Outer approaches to the Solent, English Channel. Sunk 28th Oct 1917, 19 lives lost. He is commemorated on the Tower Hill Memorial, London.

He was initiated on 10th January 1900, aged 29, Marine Engineer, 5 Ramsay Place, Broughty Ferry.



12. William George Grant,

Sergeant, 285th Siege Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery, Died 28th March 1918, age 35.

He has no known grave and is commemorated on Panel 10 Pozieres Memorial.

Probably killed during the last great German advance during March and April 1918, the 'Michael offensive'

He was initiated on 26th September 1912, described in the petition book as aged 29, an Engraver, Park Place.

13. John George Cook,

First Engineer, Mercantile Marine, S.S. Barrister (Liverpool), Died 18th Sept 1918, aged 35.

A defensively armed steamship, nine miles west of Chicken Rock near Liverpool, it was torpedoed without warning and sunk by a submarine, 30 lives lost. He is commemorated on the Tower Hill Memorial, London.

He was initiated on the 13th Feb 1908, described in the petition book as a Marine Engineer, Chestnut Cottage, King Street, Broughty Ferry.



14. James Campbell Longair,

First Engineer, aged 35, Mercantile Marine, S.S. Erindring (London). Died 4th Oct 1918

He was killed when his ship, the SS Erindring was lost in the Bay of Biscay with all hands just 5 weeks before the end of the war. Sunk by U-Boat U91.

He is also commemorated on the Tower Hill Memorial, London.

He was initiated on the 27th August 1903, aged 20, Engineer, 28 Gray Street, Broughty Ferry. Son of George and Jessie Longair; husband of Georgina Macdonald Longair, of Ashburn Place, Broughty Ferry.
