



## Brethren Killed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> World War, 1939 – 1945

#### 1. Roy Nelson.

Flight-Sergeant, R.A.F. Aged 31. died on the 18<sup>th</sup> July 1940.

Son of Richard and Daisy Nelson; husband of Leta Nelson, of Darlington.

Remembered with honour DARLINGTON WEST CEMETERY

Initiated on the 13<sup>th</sup> October 1938, Flight Sergeant, R.A.F. Montrose.



#### 2. William Paton

Second Engineer Officer, Aged 33. S.S. Baron Kelvin (Ardrossan), Merchant Navy.

Died on the 19<sup>th</sup> October 1941. Ship torpedoed by German Submarine whilst in convoy, near Gibraltar. Son of Robert P. and Alison Paton; husband of Mary F. Paton, of Dundee.

Remembered with honour TOWER HILL MEMORIAL.

Initiated on the 10<sup>th</sup> April 1930, Aged 21, Engineer, Rocklea, Broughty Ferry.



#### 3. Peter Stewart Ferrier Gall

Second Hand, H.M. Drifter Thermopylae. Aged 26. Royal Naval Patrol Service

Died on the 10<sup>th</sup> November 1941

Remembered with honour at BARNHILL CEMETERY

Initiated 13<sup>th</sup> May 1937, aged 22, Fisherman, 326 Queen Street, Broughty Ferry


#### 4. John Thomson Donaldson

Captain, Aged 40, S.S. Bengloe, Merchant Navy Died 26<sup>th</sup> May 1945 died suddenly at the Merchant Navy Transit Hotel in Naples

Husband of Mrs Donaldson, 99 Gairn Street, Aberdeen.

Remembered with honour on the TOWER HILL MEMORIAL, LONDON

Initiated 10<sup>th</sup> April 1930, aged 25, recorded as a Ship's Officer, 71 Brown Street, Broughty Ferry



#### 5. Alexander Riach Tonner

Warrant Officer Class II, 2nd Bn., Seaforth Highlanders, Aged 31, Died on the 14<sup>th</sup> July 1943 in Sicily.

Son of Charles and Elsie R. Tonnar; husband of Margaret I. S. Tonnar, of Edinburgh. Remembered with honour SYRACUSE WAR CEMETERY, SICILY

Initiated 25<sup>th</sup> April 1940, Aged 27, Sergeant, Seaforth Highlanders, c/o Bartlett, 43 Morrison Street, Edinburgh.



#### 6. David Reid Tait

Pilot Officer, Aged 23, 166 Squadron., Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve. Died on the 25<sup>th</sup> April 1944

Son of David Reid Tait and of Mary A. Tait (nee McKenna), of Broughty Ferry, Dundee.

Remembered with honour AVESNES-SUR-HELPE COMMUNAL CEMETERY, France

Initiated 10<sup>th</sup> October 1940, aged 19, Solicitor, 14 Castle Terrace, Broughty Ferry

#### 7. David Knight Lorimer,

Skipper, Aged 31, Fishing Vessel 'Ben Attow' Fishing Fleet.

Died on the 27th February 1940

Son of William Thomas Lorimer and Mary Knght Lorimer, husband of Mary H.T. Lorimer of Broughty Ferry, Angus.

Remembered with Honour at the TOWER HILL MEMORIAL, London Initiated on 12<sup>th</sup> February 1931, recorded as a Fisherman, age 22 of 27 Fort Street, Broughty Ferry.



#### 8. George Anderson

Second Hand, aged 50, Fishing Vessel 'Ben Attow' Died on the 27th February 1940

Son of John and Margaret Anderson; Husband of Barbara M. Anderson, of Broughty Ferry. Angus.

Remembered with Honour at the TOWER HILL MEMORIAL, London

Initiated on the 3<sup>rd</sup> April 1918, age 27, a Seaman of 153 Fisher Street, Broughty Ferry.

(Added to Lodge War Memorial in 2019)

#### 9. Alister Fairweather

First Radio Officer, aged 40, Merchant Navy, S.S. City of Benares (Glasgow)
Died 17<sup>th</sup> September 1940. Ship Torpedoed.
The Lodge, Airlie Park, Broughty Ferry
Remembered with Honour
at the TOWER HILL MEMORIAL, London

Initiated on the 14<sup>th</sup> July 1924, age 24, Seagoing Wireless Operator, Airlie Park Lodge, Broughty Ferry
